Livestock – Arrival, Judging & Departure

Gates will be open to livestock exhibitors between 06:00 & 08:30 on the day of the Show. Stewards will be on site to assist with unloading and penning. **No livestock to arrive the night before or stay overnight.**

Showground Holding number: 11/126/8000.

All stock will be allocated enclosed pens and bedded on shavings (to be provided by the Show).

Judging in all sections will begin at 10:00.

Sheep & Pig classes will be judged in the pens.

Cattle will be judged in a Ring (space dependant) therefore all cattle **MUST** be halter trained.

Stock may depart from 16:30, all stock must be clear by 18:00.

SPIRITS & PRESERVES

Steward: L Coombes

Spirits to be exhibited in clear 750ml bottles with white flanged corks. Ingredients must be listed on a 5cm x 2.5cm white label positioned 7.5cm from the base of the bottle. Bottles must be full to an acceptable judging level

Preserves must have been made by the Exhibitor after 1st January 2021. EXHIBITS MUST BE SHOWN IN APPROX. 450g JARS. Should have a rigid, airtight plastic cover or screw top lined with vinegar proof lining. LABELS MUST BE PLAIN WHITE (Please state date made). Lids must be new and trade names must not appear on jars or covers. Cardboard tops, loose cling film or polythene will NOT be accepted on any preserve.

Class 56: One bottle of flavoured gin or vodka, in clear half bottle with white plastic flanged cork – please state flavouring ingredients

Class 57: Jar of Mince meat,

PHOTOGRAPHY

Entries must be clearly marked on the reverse with the exhibitor Name and Class Number

ALL photographs must be mounted onto card – photographic mounts are not allowed, exhibits that are framed or behind glass will not be accepted

Nothing is to be written on the mount, photographs must fit on a 25.5cm x 30.5cm mount – no larger

RULES AND REGULATIONS

This Society is a member of the Association of Show and Agricultural Organisations and endeavours to run its competitions in line with similar shows. Competitors are asked to remember that although great care and attention goes into site planning, it is possible that changes may become necessary, even on the day - should the need arise. Adequate time should be allowed to enter and leave the Showground as traffic delays are a possibility

GENERAL COMPETITION RULES

- 1. Entries** - All entries must be on an official entry form and signed by exhibitor, owner, agent or if under 16 years of age, the exhibitor & parent/guardian. All exhibits must be owned by the exhibitor at the time of making entries. This rule obviously is superseded where exhibits are required to be bred, made, or produced by the exhibitor.
- 2. Closing Dates** - No entries will be accepted after the relevant closing date.
- 3. Refunds** - No refunds can be made for any entry after the relevant closing date.
- 4. Safety** - Exhibitors are reminded to comply with all safety regulations relating to themselves, their exhibits, and the public.
- 5. Accidents** - The Society will not be responsible for any loss, illness, damage, or accident that may occur to any animal or article exhibited at the Show. It is a condition of entry that the exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident, loss, or illness. All accidents must be reported to the Secretary's Office.
- 6. Prizes** - As printed in the schedule except where the Judge or Section Chairman reserves the right to change for whatever reason. The Judge need not award a first prize.
- 7. Prize Money** - This can be collected on Show Day in accordance with the instructions on the reverse of each card. No prize money is given out unless the relevant prize card is handed in. No prize money is posted, unless requested in writing with the relevant prize card attached and accompanied by an SAE
- 8. Judging** - No public will be allowed in the tents or judging areas while judging is in progress. The Judge's decision is final.
- 9. Entry Tickets** - Each adult (over 16 years) must give up an admission ticket when entering the Showground on show days. Should exhibitors be entitled to exhibitor or vehicle passes these will be dispatched prior to the Show. The Society asks all exhibitors to only give free passes to 'bona fide' assistants.
- 10. Objections** - An exhibitor making an objection shall do so in writing to the Secretary before 16:00. (Or at close of judging) on the relevant day of the Show and shall deposit the sum of £30. The objector must be an exhibitor in the same class. The Appeals Committee will decide the outcome by 17:00. that day and in the event of an objection being held invalid the said sum of £30 shall be forfeited to the Society.
- 11. Showground Facilities** – Refreshments and toilets are available on the Showground.
- 12. Access to the Showground** - Exhibitors are asked to follow the directional signs to the Showground and to allow adequate time for entry to the show site, parking and unloading of their entries.
- 13. Opening Hours** - Public opening hours are from 10:00 to 16.00.
- 14. Car & Lorry Parks** - Spaces will be allocated by the car parking steward and should any vehicle be discovered parked incorrectly it will be subject to a fine of £100 and removed. Competitors are asked to remember that adequate time should be allowed to enter and leave the Showground as traffic delays are a possibility. Any cars parked in any unauthorised area will be towed away to the car parking area.
- 15. Smoking** - The Society operates a no smoking rule in all tents, judging rings and in the Main Ring
- 17.** The Show organisers reserve the right to remove or amalgamate classes.

HEMOCRAFT RULES

- 1. Exhibits** - These must not have been shown at the Dorset County Show or Dorchester Agricultural Society event before.
- 2.** All entries must have been made by the exhibitor and staging of entries must be between 06:00 on the 27th November. It is a condition that all exhibits must be left on display until 16.30 Show day but collected before 18:00. Non-perishable entries can be collected from the Show Office (by 14th December) by prior arrangement with the Show Secretary during the Show.
- 3.** The Society cannot be responsible for damage or breakages during this period

HORTICULTURE RULES

1. Vegetable classes will be run under National Vegetable Society rulings and Flower classes will be run under Royal Horticultural Society rulings.
2. **Exhibits** - These must be displayed prior to 08:00 on Saturday 27th November and it is a condition of entry that all exhibits are displayed until 16:30 on the same day.

LIVESTOCK RULES

1. **Stockmen and Shepherds** - All stockmen, grooms and shepherds must follow the appropriate dress code according to the Breed Standard when parading their animals for judging i.e., white coats, etc.
2. **Veterinary & Medical Cover** - These are available on site via the Secretary's Tent between 8.00am and 6.00pm on Show days, after which a call out service is available. Exhibitors are responsible for any treatment costs incurred.
3. **Timing of Classes** - Competitors must present themselves to the judging rings in adequate time for the relevant competition.
4. **Display Boards** - The Society welcomes display boards and requests that competitors ensure that they are secured in a safe manner.
5. **DEFRA and Veterinary Inspections** - A DEFRA Inspector will be in attendance at the Show.
6. **Penning** – All stock will be penned under cover on wood shavings.
7. **Dogs** - No dogs are allowed in the livestock area.
8. **Water** - The Society provides water for animal drinking and washing

CATTLE RULES

1. **Halters** - Proper halters must be used at all times.
2. **Passports** - Passports must travel with the animals and be shown to the steward upon arrival or request. The Society will issue a BCMS label with the Society's holding number for your passport.

SHEEP RULES

1. **Health Status** - The MV and Scrapie status of all sheep must be recorded on the entry forms. Separate penning is provided for MV, Non MV and Scrapie monitored sheep. Please ensure that MV certificates (if required) have been handed in at the Sheep Secretary's Office.

PIG RULES

1. **Movement Certificates** - Competitors must hold a Show and Exhibitors Movement License.
2. **Suitability to Travel, (piglets and pregnant sows)** - Current guidelines for the movement of sows and litters should be complied with. Please consult your veterinary surgeon if in doubt.

For clarification of the rules to the various competitions, prior to the Show, please contact the Show Office
